The peer-reviewed [*Proceedings of The Royal Society of Queensland*](#) (PRSQ) is the pre-eminent generalist journal dedicated to Queensland-focused science. It has been in continuous publication since 1884. The journal is indexed by Google Scholar, Scopus, EBSCO and Informat. The next edition will be print-published at the end of 2026, but digital publication is continuous.

Scope

PRSQ publishes scholarly papers in a range of disciplines. Papers on topics in the natural sciences that are significant for Queensland and Queenslanders are particularly welcome. Papers on related topics including the social sciences, managing the natural environment, education, culture, history, philosophy, heritage and policy will be considered. PRSQ regularly publishes research articles, reviews, short communications and outlook papers.

Student abstracts

PRSQ publishes abstracts of completed honours, masters and doctoral level dissertations without further peer review and without charge. This publication opportunity exposes a student's work to an international audience. It is not necessary to be a member of the Society. Publication of these abstracts is particularly recommended for dissertations that are otherwise unlikely to enter the scholarly literature.

Heads of schools, faculty leaders and academic supervisors: Please commend this opportunity to your students and assist by submitting confirmation of completion.

The opportunity is available for a Guest Editor to assemble papers for a themed edition.

Early-career researchers

As an accessible local journal published by a non-commercial scholarly academy, PRSQ offers a low-obstacle route to publication for early-career researchers. The peer review process always improves an article, and scholarly feedback from the review process is not to be feared.

Online access

Full text searching is available online from Vol. 1, 1884. From volume 124, published early in 2020, all issues are being published open access online on the website www.royalsocietyqld.org/proceedings/. PRSQ offers an opportunity to rapidly profile current research, since articles are published online as soon as they are accepted and typeset. Print publication follows when the volume is complete. Deadline for manuscripts for the 2026 print edition is 1 July 2026. The Society can store ancillary and supporting data on its website.

Style guide

All authors are requested to use modified APA style as outlined in the 2026 *Guide to Authors*, available on the Society's website www.royalsocietyqld.org/proceedings. Papers not in this style will be returned to authors for revision.
